STATUS OF SALMON RIDGE SNOPARK TRAILS

It looks like March may be the month to go skiing on our local trails! It's dangerous to be writing about conditions 7 days before publication, but here goes:

After a month of bare gravel and green moss in the trees, the last three days of February brought snow back to our trails at Salmon Ridge. Then a few

passes with the Piston Bully and we have some pretty nice skiing! As I write this. predictions call for another foot of snow before this newsletter hits your inbox. May that be the case! If so, with a bit more grooming, the trails should give us several more weeks of skiing. Come check it out for yourself! Along with the main Razor Hone Trail, you might try Anderson or the Campground, both just across the highway. Historically, the snow on Anderson seems to last a little later in the season than Razor Hone, White Salmon, 4.5 miles further up the highway will have more snow, but little grooming.

RIVER SNOWSHOE TRAIL

It was December 28, 2023, and the day for a snowshoe trip. It was my grandson's Christmas gift to me to come to Bellingham and go with me out

Our plan was to hike out the River Trail from the parking lot and cross over to Mom's to return. We only hit one glitch. When we got to the last part of the River Trail where you are to head back into the woods, the Nooksack River had grabbed that section for itself. So, we had to backtrack a little and push through brush to get to the continuation of the trail. That entrance to the woods used to be a gentle slope up from the riverbed to the trail. However, in the last couple of years the river had encroached and eaten away at the slope so that it had first become a 3 foot jump up to get to the trail and later smoothed out, but you could not count on the river being there or not. We finished the trek and oh, did I mention it was raining that day too? It was now approaching lunch time. So, we got back in the car and resumed the drive up the mountain to find some snow.

We ended up at the Heather Meadows ski area and went to have lunch hoping that the rain would slow. It did, and we finally got to do some snow shoeing on Wild Goose trail. Don't know that we actually staved on the trail as snowshoers had made trails all over. But I got my time with my grandson, which was the whole point of the expedition!

Fast forward to January 27, Ambassador Day. In preparation for the day, the above section of River Trail needed to be fixed. So, attached is a picture of the new entrance to the route to bypass the river's encroachment. It is about 300 feet before the old entrance. It still needs a little log work as you can see from the picture but will be dryer all year.

YOUNG RACERS

It's probably true that you don't usually come to our newsletter for the latest updates on World Cup Nordic Racing – or any racing for that matter. But let's branch out...

Fortius" "Citius. Altius, the limits pushing makes individuals learn about themselves, and allows sports to improve as a whole. Broadly speaking, the Nordic nations have dominated Nordic ski racing for decades, and a tip of the hat to them for doing so! But US women have shown that they can ski with the best of them. Jessie Diggins is currently ranked number 1 in the world! (As well as winning a gold medal in the 2018

Olympics with Kikkan Randall.) But now, Gus Schumacher has won a world cup race for the men last month in Minneapolis! He was the first American man to win a world cup distance race since 1983. I first saw Gus' name in the results as a top skier in the Anchorage high school results in 2014. He stayed at or near the top for 4 years. I was reminded of this as I was collating the results of this year's state championship. The following picture (taken with a special camera) is the 1-2 finish after 7.5 km of hard racing. 0.06 seconds between them! Pretty cool! There are always young racers out going "stronger, higher, faster". Will we see them in the World Cup 6 years from now? And while we're at it. congratulations to all the skiers out on the trails enjoying the snow, whether they be the other 400+ high school racers, the 70+ year old racers at Whistler, or those out for a mellow ski at Salmon Ridge!
